

NINJA REGULATIONS Last Update 31.07.2024

1. Organization

- a. The Sports Department of the 22nd Maccabiah will be responsible for the Ninja competitions of the 22nd Maccabiah.
- b. The Ninja competitions shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Israeli Ninja Organization
- c. Participation in the competition is open to any athlete who is in possession of a Participant card, issued by the Organizing Committee of the 22nd Maccabiah and registered for the Ninja competitions.
- d. Each country may enter 10 male and 10 female athletes for each of the following age groups:
 - 1) U18 (age 2007-2010)
 - 2) Open (2008 or older)
- e. Rules for the courses and skills will be given to all athletes before each competition.

2. <u>Venues and Times</u>

a. The Sport Department of the 22nd Maccabiah will determine the venues and times of the Ninja competitions and athletes will be notified accordingly.

3. <u>Competition formats</u>

- a. All participants in all age groups may choose between competing in the COURSE format, the SKILLS format, or both formats.
- b. The course competition will be held on a separate day than the skills format competitions, giving the athletes enough time to rest between competitions.

4. <u>Program of the COURSE Competition</u>

- a. All participants in all age groups will perform a speed course run to determine the running order for the semifinals.
- b. Competitions for all age groups will be Composed of 3 rounds: speed course, semifinals, and finals.
- c. All athletes of each age group will advance from the speed course to the semifinals round.
- d. Top 20 athletes of each age group will advance from the semifinals round to the final round.
- e. Each round will present a new obstacle course and time cap.
- f. Minor changes in the courses are optional between genders and age groups.
- g. Each round and overall winners will be based on the 'furthest-fastest' scoring system.

5. <u>Program of the SKILLS Competition</u>

- a. All participants in all age groups will compete in all 4 skills disciplines:
 - 1) FIRE RINGS,
 - 2) SPINNING BAR,
 - 3) SALMON LADDER and
 - 4) ROPE CLIMB.



- b. Competitions for the FIRE RINGS, SALMON LADDER and ROPE CLIMB disciplines will be Composed of 2 rounds: semifinals, and finals.
- c. In both FIRE RINGS, SALMON LADDER and ROPE CLIMB disciplines: top 10 athletes of each age group will advance from the semifinals round to the finals round.
- d. The athlete who completes the SALMON LADDER fastest, will be declared the winner in the SALMON LADDER competition.
- e. The athlete who completes the ROPE CLIMB fastest, will be declared the winner in the ROPE CLIMB competition.
- f. In the SPINNING BAR discipline, all athletes will try to hang as long as possible on an iron spinning bar (35 millimeters diameter).
- g. Athletes in the SPINNING BAR discipline will get 2 attempts to hang on the bar as long as possible.
- h. After all athletes completed 2 hangs, the athlete who stayed on the bar the longest will be declared the winner of the SPINNING BAR competition.
- i. In the FIRE RINGS discipline, all athletes will try to cross a 20 meter line of Olympic rings and press the buzzer at the end of the line as fast as possible.
- j. Athletes in the FIRE RINGS discipline will get 2 attempts to complete the rings line as fast as possible (2 attempts in semifinals, and 2 more attempts in the finals).
- k. The athlete who completes the rings line fastest, will be declared the winner in the FIRE RINGS competition.

6. <u>System of Competitions</u>

a. The competitions will determine 8 types of winners:

Course:

- 1. Speed course winner
- 2. Course Finals winner

Skills:

- 1. SPINNING BAR winner
- 2. FIRE RINGS winner
- 3. SALMON LADDER winner
- 4. ROPE CLIMB winner
- 5. SKILLS overall winner

Combined: NINJA overall winner (course + skills combined)

b. Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be given to the top 3 athletes in each of the Podiums for male and female athletes in each category.

7. <u>Judges</u>

The Sports Department and the Israeli Ninja Organization will appoint the judges of the competition.

8. <u>General</u>

- a. These regulations are but one part of the complete 22nd Maccabiah Regulations and must be read along with the instructions found in the Maccabiah Basic Regulations.
- b. In the event of a discrepancy between the regulations written here and those appearing in the Maccabiah Basic Regulations, the regulations written here will prevail, apply and be binding
